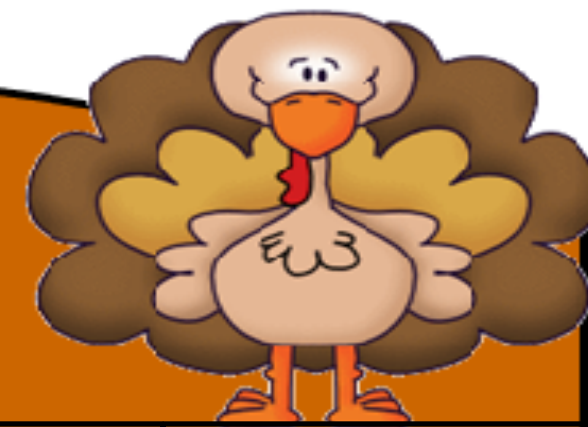

What might an alien see in it's rocket?	<b>6</b> Make an alien out of play dough.	<b>7</b> /Aa/ is for alien and astronaut. Make up a story with both as characters.
<b>8</b> Draw a picture of an alien using your favorite color.	<b>9</b> <b>Happy Birthday Lois Ehlert!</b> Read "Nuts to You" or another Ehlert book today!	<b>10</b> Cut out different sized circles or squares. Have your child arrange them from smallest to largest.	<b>11</b> <b>Veteran's Day</b> -Thank you veterans-make a card or draw a picture for a soldier.	<b>12</b> Ants on Log snack - together fill a section of celery with cream cheese (or peanut butter or yogurt) . Place raisins on top.	<b>13</b> /Aa/ is for address. Teach your child yours. Find the numbers on your home.	<b>14</b> Make a list of names (or animals) that start with /Aa/.
<b>15</b> Read the Sunday comics to your child.	<b>16</b> /Aa/ is for apple. Cut an apple up for snack today. Count how many pieces there are.	<b>17</b> /Aa/ is for alligator. Read a book about an alligator.	<b>18</b> Pretend an old box or laundry basket is a space ship. Count down to blast off!	<b>19</b> /Aa/ is for America. Look at a map of our country and find our state.	<b>20</b> Put a pile of socks in order from biggest to smallest.	<b>21</b> Tell the story of the First Thanksgiving. (Julie Craighead George and Linda Haywood have picture book options.)
<b>22</b> <b>National Game and Puzzle Week</b> -Have a family game night, with a <u>board</u> game.	<b>23</b> /Aa/ is for alphabet. Eat alphabet soup for lunch. Find the letters in your name.	<b>24</b> Play with alphabet blocks or magnets. Help your child spell his or her name.	<b>25</b> <b>Full Moon</b> -go outside and look in the sky. What space things do you see?	<b>26</b> <b>Happy Thanksgiving</b> Make a list of reasons to be thankful.	<b>27</b> <b>Happy Birthday Kevin Henkes</b> Read a title by him! Try my favorite "Julius the Baby of the World"	<b>28</b> Look at the stars. Ask your child to imagine what it would be like to be an alien on the moon.
<b>29</b> /Aa/ is for act. Act out movement words with your child, such as hop, gallop, and leap.	<b>30</b> Sing "1 Little, 2 Little, 3 Little Indians".
