

Take turns playing “I Spy something yellow.”</p>	<p>10</p> <p>Practice writing your first name – write in pencil, crayon and then marker!</p>	<p>11</p> <p><b>Happy Birthday Mo Willems</b> Read a Knuffle Bunny, Elephant &amp; Piggie or Pigeon title to celebrate</p>	<p>12</p> <p><b>Happy Birthday Abraham Lincoln</b> Make and/or wear a top hat today</p>	<p>13</p> <p>/Yy/ is for Yo-Yo. Count how many times in a row, you can yo-yo.</p>	<p>14</p> <p><b>Valentine's Day</b> Read some Valentine's together and point out all the “you” and “I”.</p>
<p>15</p> <p>Count all those Valentine's that came home. Sort them in different ways – by size, color, from girls, from boys, etc.</p>	<p>16</p> <p>/Yy/ is for Yell. Have an outdoor Yelling contest. Who can yell “I Love You” the loudest?</p>	<p>17</p> <p><b>Mardi Gras</b> Wear costume jewelry and have a parade.</p>	<p>18</p> <p>Talk about the length of a Year. How many months, weeks, days does it have? What year is it? What years were family members born?</p>	<p>19</p> <p><b>Chinese New Year</b> Read a Chinese Menu together and determine what year it is (Year of the Dog, Monkey, Rabbit?)</p>	<p>20</p> <p>Have a frozen Yogurt treat today. Or, use yogurt to make a smoothie. Is it a yum or yuck?</p>	<p>21</p> <p>Read any book with “You” in the title.</p>
<p>22</p> <p><b>Happy Birthday George Washington</b> Read a biography like “George Washington's Teeth”</p>	<p>23</p> <p>Young animals often have special names (like kitty, puppy, fawn, or calf) to distinguish them from their mothers. Find pictures of mama-baby pairs on-line or in a book.</p>	<p>24</p> <p>/Yy/ is for Yarn. Use yarn to write the letter /Yy/.</p>	<p>25</p> <p>Sing and illustrate the song “You Are My Sunshine.” (Count how many times you sing “you” in the song.)</p>	<p>26</p> <p>How many rhyming words can you think of for the word “Yummy?” Make a list.</p>	<p>27</p> <p>Play a game of Simon Says with instructions to stand or sit: over, under, between, beside, behind, in front of something. (Repeat with a stuffed animal.)</p>	<p>28</p> <p>February is the shortest month – do 28 jumping jacks for February. Then, do 30 or 31 for the longer months.</p>
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
